You are in me and I in you (Wednesday)

I call you my friend (Thursday)

Do not be afraid (Friday)

Response:

Creator God I hold my day before you, especially ...

I hold before you Lord, all those I love, especially....

I hold before you Lord those who are sad because someone they love has died...

I hold before you Lord those I know who are troubled this day...

I hold before you Lord all those who I will meet this day...

Lord God grant me the faith this day to truly walk in the light of Christ:

Christ, as a light Illumine and guide me. Christ as a shield Overshadow me. Christ under me: Christ over me; Christ beside me on my left and my right. This day be within me and without me, lowly and meek, yet all powerful. Be in the heart of each to whom I speak: In the mouth of each who speaks unto me.
